- Pitch Perfect is an interactive workshop for writers which will help you perfect your "elevator pitch" to publishers and readers. Friday at 5:30pm.
- Promptapalooza is a "laid back, prompt-based" writing workshop. Bring a notebook and pen or your laptop. Saturday at 1:00pm.
