Interview with the GoH: John Scalzi, Author GoH

What is your funniest (yet fit to print) convention memory?

At the 2004 Worldcon, I was on a panel with Esther Friesner, Craig Shaw Gardner, Terry Prachett and Connie Willis on how the future would view the 20th Century. Since at the time I had nothing published in science fiction, there was some question as to why I was even on such a panel with so many high-wattage folks, but hey, I wasn't going to complain. During the panel, Terry Pratchett was talking about archeology and how some things could be remarkably well-preserved, and as an example he talked about latrines in Jerusalem which thanks to a low presence of oxygen had their contents preserved since the time of Jesus. To which I responded, "Holy crap!" And then got to enjoy the benefits of my sitcom timing as the audience laughed for several long seconds. It's not every day you get to deliver a punchline to Terry Pratchett, even one that's essentially a bad pun. It's one of my favorite convention memories.

What SF / F book(s) have you read so many times that the binding fell apart?

None! However, this is because I grew up poor and as a result learned how to read paperbacks without breaking their spines, so that I could keep them longer. As a result I have paperbacks that I have read and reread over 25 or 30 years -- their pages are yellow but their spines are GORGEOUS.
